**#1. Hopes and Achievements: Collaborative Teaching in LOTE Classrooms!**  
**Presenter: Kristen Lincks**

Come prepared to learn and discuss strategies for collaborative teachers in today's LOTE classrooms. Whether your school has a dedicated LOTE inclusion class or not, come learn instructional techniques you can use yourself or share with the special education teachers in your building to help reach all of your students! Discover the changes that we can make together to ensure success for all learners! (*Target Audience: All grade levels and languages*)

**#2. Story Map Your Way to Successful Reading in the LOTE Classroom**  
**Presenter: Linda Stack**

This hands-on workshop will be presented in English with examples in Italian relating to a story about Christopher Columbus. However, these tools can easily be adapted to other stories and languages. Participants will work cooperatively in groups, experiencing first-hand what their students will be asked to do. Teachers will be given all materials necessary to use this lesson in their classrooms. Knowledge of Italian is not necessary to take this workshop. (*Target Audience: All grade levels and languages*)

**#3. Techniques for Goal-Directed Teaching**  
**Presenter: Diane Iglesias**

Do your classroom activities truly support your stated teaching goals? This workshop is intended for teachers of all levels and will analyze the effectiveness of class presentations and illustrate specific techniques geared to simplify learning for students of all ability levels. (*Target Audience: All grade levels and languages*)



**#4. Learning Styles: Different Strokes for Different Folks!**

**Presenter: Melissa Perna**

Participants will learn how to redesign the conventional classroom to accommodate the different learning styles that exist among their students and to use tactile and kinesthetic resources to introduce new and difficult topics in language instruction. (*Target Audience: All grade levels and languages*)

**#5. Pack Your Suitcase and Let's Travel!**

**Presenter: Christina Visbal**

This workshop is a "hands-on" demonstration of portfolio development for all levels, including a video of student responses to self and peer assessment. Examples of portfolios will be on hand and a packet of developmental materials will be distributed. (*Target Audience: All grade levels and languages*)

**#6. Linking LOTE: Creating Leaders in Global Citizenship**

**Presenter: Regina Casale**

Participants will learn how to connect LOTE to other disciplines through the use of film and a series of interdisciplinary lessons that incorporate NYS Standards. Sample lessons, a list of useful websites, and a suggested movie list will be provided. (*Target Audience: High School Teachers*)

**#7. Technology in the LOTE Classroom**

**Presenter: Doug Moore**

Participants will be presented with various ways technology can be incorporated into the LOTE classroom, including the use of web quests, class web pages and games like "jeopardy". (*Target Audience: Technology for all grade levels and languages*) **Max. enrollment: 25**

**#8. Mini Internet Lessons for the LOTE Classroom**

**Presenter: Alba Masullo**

Participants will be exposed to a variety of internet sites in French, Italian, and Spanish that can be used to teach daily lessons that focus on the National and State Standards for LOTE, while integrating technology in a fun and relevant manner. In addition, web-based tasks to prepare students for upcoming changes to the Spanish AP exam will also be presented. (*Target Audience: Technology for all grade levels and languages*) **Max. enrollment: 25**

**#9. Lively Lessons for the FLES Class!**

**Presenter: Mary Jo Clines**

Participants will come away with lesson ideas for FLES students. Although examples will be given for French classes, these can be easily adapted to any target language. Emphasis will be on the instruction of both language and culture. (*Target Audience: FLES Teachers*)



- #10. **Recycled Treasure for the FLES Classroom!**  
**Presenter: Rosemary Firestein**  
 Learn how to use recycled materials to create exciting and meaningful projects your FLES students will love. (*Target Audience: FLES Teachers*)
- #11. **In Step with the French AP!**  
**Presenter: Gene Lowenberg**  
 This workshop will review the goals of an advanced placement language class and review the training required to prepare for the AP exam. Participants will explore the many resources available to teachers of AP French and discuss a variety of ideas for preparing our students to be successful in this course. (*Target Audience: Teachers of AP French*)
- #12. **AP Italian: Teaching Towards the Next Level!**  
**Presenter: Lucrezia Lindia**  
 In addition to exploring issues and concerns that are of special interest to teachers of AP Italian, participants will be presented with a variety of activities and strategies that students will need in order to experience success on the AP Italian Exam. (*Target Audience: Teachers of AP Italian*)
- #13. **Attacking the AP Spanish Exam**  
**Presenter: Lucille Minutillo**  
 A review of strategies for perfecting the four skills that need to be mastered for the AP Spanish exam, including mnemonic devices, shortcuts, teaching aids, and successful tools for enabling students to achieve mastery of these skills. There will also be a time for sharing of successful teaching strategies: participants are encouraged to bring 30 copies of one idea to share! (*Target Audience: Teachers of AP Spanish*)
- #14. **Seven Steps to Efficient Lesson Planning**  
**Presenter: Ronnie Maibaum**  
 Participants will be guided in the development of lesson plans that will help new teachers be more successful in the classroom. Sample plans will be provided. (*Target Audience: Student Teachers & Methods Students*)
- #15. **Surviving Your First Years in the Classroom!**

 Come hear successful strategies for making your first years less stressful. This workshop will cover materials that every ASL teacher can use to supplement their current ASL curriculum while meeting NYS standards. This workshop will cover ASL 1, 2, and 3 on the high school level, as well as a review of the ASL Regents examination. (*Target Audience: Teachers of American Sign Language*)

### DIRECTIONS TO COMSEWOGUE HIGH SCHOOL

**From all points west:** Take the LIE East to Exit 63- N. Ocean Avenue/CR-83. Make a left at the light onto N. Ocean Avenue. Take N. Ocean Avenue to Old Town Road. Make a left onto Old Town Road. Make a right onto N. Bicycle Path (3rd light) School is approx. 1 1/2 miles on the right.

**From all points east:** Take the LIE West to Exit 64- Rt. 112. Take Rt. 112 North towards Port Jefferson - approx 7 miles. Make a left onto N. Bicycle Path (Getty Gas on left and car dealership on the right). School is approx 1/2 mile on the left.
