#1. VISION OF LOTE IN NEW YORK STATE

What is happening with LOTE at the New York State Education Department today? What direction will LOTE take in New York State in the future? Discover how to get there together to prepare students for global participation. Various initiatives for developing programs at the New York State Education Department will be discussed.

#3. M.A.R.S. RETURNS.... WITH A FRENCH TWIST

Participants will come away with an arsenal of strategies and techniques to help their students master and retain some of the basic grammatical structures and cultural features of their chosen target language.

#4. DAZZLE YOUR CLASSES WITH MORE CREATIVE PUPPET PERFORMANCES!

#6. CELEBRATING DIVERSITY IN AND BEYOND THE WORLD LANGUAGE CLASSROOM

See how Yahoo!, You Tube and other online resources provide a plethora of music in the target language, providing FUN lessons students look forward to attending.

#11. MUSIC TO MY EARS

Teachers will discover a hands-on approach as to how young children acquire language through song. A variety of holiday songs will be taught through an interactive presentation for all ages. Participants will leave with their own songbook and resources for creating child friendly songs in their classroom.

Do you need fresh ideas (games, songs and activities) for your K-6 FLES classes? *Un Poquito de Todo - Parte II* will provide you with just that... a little bit of everything! #13. SMART BEGINNINGS

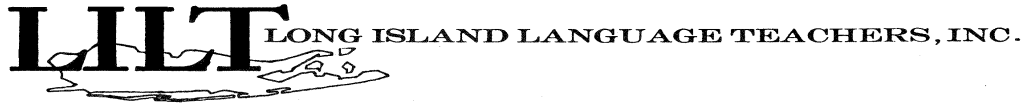

From Eastern Long Island:

L.I.E. East to Exit 56 (Rte. 111). Continue on Rte. 111, which bears left at Hauppauge High School, cross over Rte. 347 and continue on Rte. 111 to Jericho Turnpike (Main St.) and make a left. Go west on Jericho Turnpike past the Stop and Shop, past the Bull, under the trestle; at the traffic light make a right this is Meadow Road. Stay to the right at the traffic light on Meadow Rd. and continue about a mile and a half. The entrance to the school is on the left. There is a sign for Accomsett Middle School.

From the West:

Traveling on the Northern State Parkway from the west go to the end. Make a left at Old Willets Path and continue to Jericho Turnpike. (Rte. 25). Make a right, going east to Meadow Rd; this is the first traffic light you come to after you turn on to Jericho Turnpike. Make a left on to Meadow Road (Medical Clinic on the left side) and bear to the right at fork. Continue about a mile and a half, the entrance of the school is on the left. There is a sign for Accomsett Middle School.
