## **LILT 2005 WINTER WORKSHOP DESCRIPTIONS**

### **Session 1 Motivating Students & Managing the LOTE Classroom**

This session will provide strategies and activities to motivate student learning and achieve effective classroom control. (Most appropriate for middle school teachers)
